Nurture Student Strengths and Reveal Core Talents

The **GRS 2** provides the opportunity to view a student's strengths and abilities through a more holistic view providing unique insights. This is accomplished by comparing each student's administered scales to each other, rather than a peer group, to better understand an individual student's relative strengths. This type of information can be used to leverage student strengths in particular domains and recommend differentiated instruction and curriculum to both gifted and non-gifted students.

INTELLECTUAL ABILITY

Verbal and/or nonverbal mental skills, capabilities, or intellectual competence.

ACADEMIC ABILITY

Factual and/or school-related material.

CREATIVITY

Ability to think, act, and/or produce unique, original, novel, or innovative thoughts or products.

ARTISTIC TALENT

Potential for, or evidence of, ability in drama, music, dance, drawing, painting, sculpture, singing, playing a musical instrument, and/or acting.

MOTIVATION

Drive or persistence, desire to succeed, tendency to enjoy challenging tasks, and ability to work well without encouragement or reinforcement.

LEADERSHIP

Ability to motivate people toward a common goal.

COGNITIVE ABILITY

Reflects the child's academic skills, problem solving, reasoning, memory, and ability to learn. It encompasses verbal and/or nonverbal mental skills, capabilities, or intellectual competence, mental speed, and skill in dealing with factual and/or school-related material.

CREATIVE/ARTISTIC ABILITY

Reflects the child's ability to think, act, and/or produce unique, original, novel, or innovative thoughts or products. Artistic/Creative Ability can be expressed in a variety of ways: how a child solves problems, experiments with new ideas, formulates a solution to a group project, uses imagination, or through mediums such as art, acting, singing, music, writing, or dance.

SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL SKILLS

Reflects the child's ability to get along with others, handle stress well, stay calm in difficult situations, and be motivated and enthusiastic. This scale is a measure of a child's social skills/competence and emotional intelligence/resilience. Social-Emotional Skills can be observed in a variety of contexts, such as when working on challenging academic tasks or artistic endeavors or engaging in a group environment.

The Social-Emotional Skills scale—introduced in the Parent Form—was developed as a result of research into important social-emotional skills that promote the success and well-being of all youth, including the gifted and talented (Pfeiffer, 2017)¹.

Response Style Indicators

Interpretation of the **GRS 2** assumes that teachers or parents have rated items thoughtfully and carefully. The first step in the interpretation process is to consider whether the raters provided usable data. Response Style Indicators are a new feature of the **GRS 2** that provides insights into how raters approached completing the rating scale. There are three different types.

OMITTED ITEMS

Indicates the number of items that did not receive a rating. If too many items are left unanswered, a score cannot be calculated for that scale.

INCONSISTENCY INDEX

Indicates whether a rater responded to similar items differently. This index includes pairs of items that were selected because they were highly related to each other; thus, rating these pairs differently would be highly unusual.

IDENTICAL RATINGS

Indicates whether identical ratings were provided for all items. Identical ratings for all items are extremely uncommon.
